I have faith that you as a church will courageously make the tough choices, and the right choices in the future, and will continue to be a light in this community for many, many years to come.

It is truly with great sorrow that I will be leaving this place, and part of my heart will remain here forever. I have deeply fallen in love with every one of you. You all have my phone number, and I will always be a phone call away from a conversation. I will always be here as a friend to share your burdens with, to provide a listening ear, or simply to have a good laugh with. I will be watching you from a distance, praying fervently for you, and I know I will be delighted with your future successes in reaching and leading many new souls into more light and the great joy of worshipping and serving alongside all of you.






