SHIPWRECKED Rescued by Jesus! BE PREPARED FOR A **WONDERFUL WEEK AT VBS!**

1:00 - 4:00 pm Ages 3-12 De Soto Baptist Church

We hope all children and their families are excited about spending a week at DBC for our annual Vacation Bible School. This year's theme is "Shipwrecked: Rescued by Jesus." Each day we will learn how knowing Jesus can rescue us from being lonely, worried, feeling guilty, struggling with difficulties, and even feeling powerless.

Children will have these lessons taught in a variety of ways and reinforced at every activity center they visit. The Bible Stories, Bible Points, and Bible Verses will be shared at every stop: Bible Discovery, Ship-Rec Games, Tropical Treats, KidVid Cinema, Imagination Station, and at the opening and closing gatherings.

Children ages 5-12 are divided into small "mini crews" of 4-5 children. Three "Mini crews" will make up the "Main Crews" that are led by adults. Either adults or teen/junior leaders will be in charge of the "mini crews" so the children have one special person who knows them by name and works just with them. They will rotate from one station to the next throughout the afternoon. Children ages 3-5 (who have not attended Kindergarten) will be in the Pre-K class, led by a Certified Pre-K teacher and many youth helpers. They will rotate through the stations as well.

Each year we choose a service project of some kind for our children to learn about and to be the recipient of their daily offerings. This year we will be supporting one of our own American Baptist Home Missions: the Murrow Indian Children's Home in Muskogee, Oklahoma. We hope to share the many needs and provisions provided at Murrow as well as having them see pictures of the activities

Please be sure to share this information with friends, neighbors, and extended family members. We would love to have increased enrollment this year. . . touching more children than ever before. 

LEO GIBSON OF THE KANSAS CITY COMETS' WINS HUMANITARIAN AWARD

Kansas City Comets Leo Gibson was named the inaugural winner of the Major Arena Soccer League's (MASL) Ed Tepper Humanitarian Award for his charity Kick for Christ and his work with the local Kansas City community.

Leo has partnered with De Soto Baptist for the last 4 years to put on the Kick for Christ soccer camp for children of De Soto & is preparing to do so again on June 22nd & 23rd. Kick for Christ is a Christian charity organization founded by Liberian natives Leo Gibson and Worteh Sampson, both soccer players of the Kansas City Comets. The purpose of this organization is to provide soccer gear and professional soccer training opportunities to the youth of Liberia, West Africa, Haiti, and Kansas City. Leo collects gently used sporting and athletic equipment which he then distributes to kids who could not normally afford them on their own. Each year he coordinates a trip to Liberia where he distributes equipment, along with everyday essentials to those in need.

The vision of Kick for Christ in Kansas City is to exemplify Christ's love to the youth of Kansas City through sports ministries, and life coaching, that would: Encourage them with the gospel of Christ through local outreach coaching clinics (soccer camps, etc.). We are so thankful that Leo uses his gifts and talents for God's glory and has blessed the children of De Soto with this wonderful ministry as well. May the Lord continue to bless Leo and Kick for Christ!
