- Grades K-5 meet downstairs, teachers rotate.




## Doers of the Word Women's Bible Study

Dear God, it is Presidents' Day In this nation in which we live. We are so grateful and thankful For the blessings that You give.


Please lead and guide our President, We ask as we earnestly pray. We pray for his heart to be right, So he can lead in a Godly way.

# CHANGE THE GAME

MORE THAN 28 YEARS AGO, the Souper Bowl of Caring began with a simple prayer from a single youth group:

"Lord, even as we enjoy the Super Bowl football game, help us be mindful of those without a bowl of soup to eat."

Since that day, more than \$135 million has been raised for local charities across the country through Souper Bowl of Caring. It has become a powerful movement that is transforming the time around the Big Game into the nation's largest celebration of giving and serving.

The youth of De Soto Baptist Church have been a part of this movement from the beginning. Church members bring their favorite soups to share with others on Super Bowl Sunday and the youth serve and bus tables, all while gathering donations for a chosen charity. We invite you to join us and be part of this movement that is sharing God's love with those in need.

Every dollar raised at this year's event will to go to benefit the Towner family, who are enduring incredible challenges after a terrible accident.

On January 13<sup>th</sup>, Jeremy and Coen Towner were burning trash when a gas can caught fire and blew up causing extensive burns covering 30% of Coen's body and severely burning both Jeremy's hands. Jeremy has been released from the hospital, but still has a long road of recovery ahead of him. Coen will be in the hospital for a minimum of 30 days. He has already undergone multiple surgeries and will continue to have many more in the days to come.

The family's faith in God and strength they are finding in HIM during this difficult time is inspiring. Jamie wrote on Facebook 1/17/18:

"Thank you all! I have nothing but grateful tears for the love that has been shown. I'm in awe and have no words. In a world that has been hard and ugly, there is so much love! You all are that love! The light! We are truly blessed. God is so good."

May the De Soto Baptist Church, and the whole De Soto community join together in continuing to share Christ's love with our neighbor in need by covering them in prayer and by financially supporting them during this difficult time.




