### From the Pastor's Pen ~

**W**OW! Words are truly not adequate for the wonderful VBS experience, which we credit with thanksgiving to God's incredible providence, as well as to so many faithful servants of DBC who responded to God's call to be part of this ministry, in the many and varied uses of the "giftings" with which God has blessed each of you! Any Pastor would feel very blessed to

have such great, talented, and committed leadership and helpers in the many and varied avenues of service needed to bring about such an experience as we've just had. Our prayer is that the impact of this experience for the involved children and youth will have a very positive and far-reaching influence.

It's very significant to note that the daily offerings received were used to enhance the Ministry of our American Baptist Indian Children's Home in Muskogee, Oklahoma! This constituted a mission outreach beyond our own local church and will bless in the coming weeks 19 children of Indian heritage, especially as the school year begins.

Nearing completion of 58 years in Pastoral or Christian Education leadership, I am convinced as never before of the very strong connection between our efforts of outreach, or sharing, and the successes and blessings realized both as individuals and as a corporate "Body of Believers". Now this may sound a little "wordy", but in reality it's quite simple. In our De Soto Baptist family I see a phenomenal picture as described in this statement. As we in obedience have consistently and increasingly been involved in support of Missions, including within our denomination, our community, and in a diversity of ways God calls. While our very close and meaningful interaction with Bethel Neighborhood Center goes back 50 years when several families brought children out to De Soto to spend a week away from the poverty-stricken neighborhoods in which they lived, as the decades have passed involvement has changed, although still meaningful through more than a dozen different ministry outreaches to all ages.

As we're aware Bethel has been in a very focused campaign to raise funds for expansion and correction of needs in the existing structure – begun with the \$39,000 AB Women across our Region raised so the 2 aging vans would not continue to be victimized by stealing catalytic converters! --- and after the unplanned dealing with contaminated soil and other issues work is now well underway on restructuring and updating of the existing facility which ministers to more than 10,000 individuals in the KC, Ks. area. Especially important is the outside restructuring so that children won't be dropped off on the very busy 12<sup>th</sup> street in front of the current building. The sad situation is that the adjoining "new" facility is on hold for lack of funds, meaning some ministries such as that to the Sr. Citizens cannot continue.

This being the case, God's people (meaning the Board) have secured a foundation which will match all funds up to \$300,000 so progress can include the planned new facility; and by the time you read this a major phone campaign will have taken place, but work will continue until all needed funds are raised. I well remember the meager "Pre-Marital" counseling we had with my beloved Uncle George (who pastored 1 Southern Baptist Church for 28 years) around my Grandmother's small kitchen table at our family Thanksgiving gathering, when he asked if either of us had felt a call to be Missionaries, to which our answer was negative. And we both continue to be blessed beyond words that our "Mission Field" has primarily been DE SOTO BAPTIST, but also joyous for such Missions opportunities as BETHEL and MURROW INDIAN CHILDREN'S HOME - - - and we were offered the opportunity by the Home Missions Board in Valley Forge to be Directors at Murrow, with the head actually coming to De Soto to visit with us 40+ years ago.

This is both a great "prayer need" as well as "monetary challenge", so may we all be in prayer for God's incredible presence and providence in the furtherance of His Kingdom on earth . . . and in the lives of not just our De Soto Baptist Family, but also within the 10,000 in the circle of Bethel's Ministry!

### A MOMENT WITH JO

"Whenever I am afraid, I will trust in You. In God (I will praise His word), in God I have put my trust." ~Psalms 56:3-4

he other morning, I was sorting through some notebooks and saw the writing was October 16, 2013, October 17, and October 31. The first writing on the 16th was a day after I was called by my doctor's nurse. She told me I had lymphoma and here is the name and number of an oncologist and then hung up the phone. Soon after that call, our daughter, Amy, a nurse, and her husband, Dave came and began looking for oncologists at KU Med Center. I was very grateful to have them take over and relieve me of that duty.

In the notebook, I had a list of people to call, scriptures, dates of doctor visits, biopsy appointment, and encouragement from the Lord to come away and hear His plan. We left for a few days to Branson, where we prayed, pondered this new direction in our life, and to hear His plan. One night in Branson, I was lying in bed and praying for His help to stay the fear that would arise in me. I felt the presence of the Holy Spirit's warmth and I heard Him say that He would heal me. After returning to De Soto, I awoke to taunting voices of the enemy. I arose from bed and turned on the Pandora music that is always peaceful to hear. The song that was playing was about holiness. I said to the Lord that I so needed to hear His sweet voice. He put His arms around me and said "only listen to My voice." I told Him that my body is the temple of the Holy Spirit and something that wasn't of Him could not remain in my body. Immediately, I had a text from my dear friend, Mary, who said to read the day's devotional from Anne Graham Lotz. Here are the Scriptures I wrote: Zech. 4:6," Not by might nor by power, but by My Spirit, says the Lord." I Sam. 17:47," the battle is the Lord's." Hag. 2:5," My Spirit remains among you, do not fear." Later, I began singing the song Holy Ground.

I knew a long and difficult journey was ahead, but He reminded me that He held me in the palm of His hand and as Is. 43:13 tells us, that there is no one who can deliver from His hand; He will work and who will reverse it? It was a blessing to me that I found this notebook and remembered the many emotions, fears, pain, but most of all the kindness of our Lord Jesus Christ. At my last consultation with my oncologist, he said, "Jo, you are 4 years out and I do not think it is coming back." Praise the name of the Lord.


