I encourage each reader to reach out to those who would appreciate and benefit by the special invitation you could share in the name of Christ's love, as shown that day on the Cross, in the Tomb, and at His Resurrection. May we all be true witnesses of what that time in history means to us today!


MAUNDY THURSDAY COMMUNION SERVICE
