FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN ~



We are always grateful to the church for providing in my job description time to "get away" for rest and renewal. In the Scriptures we read where Jesus said to His disciples, "Come with me . . . to a quiet place and get some rest." Why did Jesus take time to rest? Most of the passages I've read believe it was so that when He worked, he'd be at His best. I believe this is a lesson for all of us. It is easy to feel like "there is too much to do" so we neglect taking care of ourselves while focusing instead on the needs of

others in our circles of family and friends. Jesus handled it differently: Because so many people were coming and going that He and His Disciples did not even have a chance to eat, He gave to them the above directive. And they went away in obedience to this call on their lives.

This brings to mind the question as to if this isn't actually a needed lesson for each of us in our continuing walks in following Christ; and I further see the analogy of this with an individual's involvement in "Team Sports." When a player joins a team such as basketball, soccer, or football, we think of the importance or desire, preparation, training, focus, attitude, etc. But during the game there are times for a "time out" or the "halftime" which involves spending some minutes with the Coach to rethink strategy . . . or to regroup or hear words of encouragement . . . or possibly just to rest or catch our breath. I feel there is a lesson here for each of us in our own "game of life". It is of great importance that if we want to do our best then we need to see the value of taking a "timeout" for listening to "our Coach". Isn't this also the reason God set aside the "seventh day" of the week – "our Sabbath" – for rest and renewal?

Now, I'll admit that this is NOT exactly how we spent our time away!!! But it did contribute to the accomplishment of some of the above goals! While the idea did not originate with us, it was an incredible journey of more "renewal than rest" in our Christian journeys. We met in Nashville with 2 other couples with whom our paths crossed and journeys began more than 60 years ago at Ottawa University; and while I went prepared with games we could play for entertainment, we spent a significant amount of time each day (when not eating!!!) with each one sharing about their personal walks with Christ and the guidance of the Holy Spirit along the journey. . . along with the part Ottawa University contributed to our journeys.

ROOTS AND RELATIONSHIPS

At the end of last Sunday's message, I talked of "cultivating roots and relationships" through Bible study, daily devotionals, and interaction with fellow believers. I wanted to give you the names of a few resources that you might check out

If I could choose one modern resource, it would be this wonderful on-line site or phone app: https://www.youversion.com/the-bible-app/

This resource is available in hundreds of languages and multiple translations. It is free, and it is easy to use. It is designed so that you can instantly find a bible passage with just a phrase that you know or a topic that you want to explore. If you don't want to read the passage, it will read it for you.

Each day there is a passage that is posted for your inspiration. There are literally hundreds of bible study plans - for 5 days or for a full year - developed by famous Christian speakers and teachers – focusing on all areas of interest. I urge you to check this out. There is also a Bible app for children - with animated pictures and stories that are read to them.

Finally, there is a wonderful story about how this online resource came into being. It is tied to an Oklahoma University fraternity looking for a "PR opportunity" and a Gideon. It's worth the read. Google: *The Ultimate Bible App/Guideposts*. That should be enough to find the story, but the article was in the August, 2014, edition. Enjoy!!
