FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

As I write this I'm sitting on a balcony and enjoying the beautiful scenery of Orange Beach, Alabama, with a very grateful heart recognizing all who helped to make this possible. Over the years I've learned the value and importance of a Pastor and wife "getting away" from time to time. And linked to this I've come to recognize basically 3 different forms of "getting away".

I – One that I recognize is that of being with loved ones or friends for several days of quality time. This is an important time with family for fun and fellowship or experiencing some new adventures together without the usual pressures of responsibilities of home or work. However, this can sometimes be something of a tiring situation!

II – Convention or Conference attendance is another type of involvement bringing the opportunity to "get away". While being away from the normal home and work responsibilities one is involved in a somewhat stressful experience of "being up" from early to late for extended days of meetings or workshops and the added demands of being with people constantly until fairly late at night . . . with the added demand to be up early the next morning, often for another round of business, beginning with breakfast meetings demanding high level thinking and problem solving! While the value of such experiences is worth the effort involved, with inspirational speakers, learning and gaining helpful and encouraging information from the experience as well as sharing with others in similar vocations, it' can still be very exhausting! And I write this from decades of such personal experiences!

III – The third type of very helpful and needed "get away" is the "retreat" type of just myself and my wife. It is indeed the most relaxing with no schedule to adhere to. It offers time for reading, Bible Study, prayer, sermon preparation, reflection, walking, visiting a museum . . . and yes, even a *Flea Market!!!* Such was the case with Orange Beach! Finding a book published in 2019, entitled "*Devotions from the Beach*", we this year spent about 3 hours each morning reading, and journaling, and sharing with each other the message from each as they spoke to us personally. We basically read through with discussion 52 devotional themes, which was half the book. And now we can continue, still envisioning the beautiful sunrises, lapping waves, and beautiful, powdery, white sand under the palm trees!!!

However, after being away it is always good to get home and back to the Ministry and people that we love. In the words of the Apostle Paul, *"I press toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus."* (Philippians 3:14) My prayer is that each reader will look back on your summer with acknowledgement of God's work in your life and the beauty that he's provided around you!

P.S. One evening we were having dinner at the Lodge in Denali Park as a couple who were in our group stopped and commented on the beauty of our day and all the animals we had seen. I shared with them that through the entire trip, a song continued to bubble up in me called "Good Good Father". The next morning, they told us that they had looked on YouTube and listened to the song twice and so enjoyed it. They shared they are Catholic and do not usually sing those songs, but they liked it very much. May we always be ready to give a good report or song.

The Doers will begin their new ladies Bible study October 14, 2019 and will be held the Second and Fourth Monday of each month.



The cost for the book is \$10. It's not too late to get your name in.




De Soto Food Pantry Needs Your Help! The shelves at the food pantry are looking pretty bare. All nonperishable food,
