DBC Youth group will be collecting items for Samaritans Purse Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Project!

If you'd like to pack a box you can do that too!

We will be collecting cash donations as well. Each box requires a \$9 cover charge for collection/processing and shipping to over 100 countries plus Gospel materials written in the children's language.

Age Category - 2 - 14 years old

<u>Items to Include</u> – stuffed animal, soccer ball with pump, or clothing outfit, hat/scarf/mittens, wrist watch, sunglasses tote, hair clips, hair ribbons, elastic hair bands, School Supplies, Craft items, chalkboard & chalk, sewing kit, fabric, ribbon, gardening kit, jump rope, puzzles, etc.

<u>Do Not Include</u> – Candy; toothpaste; gum; used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives, or military figures; chocolate or food; seeds; fruit rolls or other fruit snacks; drink mixes (powdered or liquid); liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.

There will be a collection box in the vestibule. Monetary donations should be made out to the church with a notation for Shoebox gifts.

Once everything is collected the youth will sort and pack the shoeboxes and most importantly, pray for the child who will receive the gift and maybe even include a personal note and photo and then deliver them to the donation center.

Remember – everything has to fit in a shoebox

Deadline for donations is November 10th.




