FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

"I bring you good news of great joy!" This proclamation from the Angels to the Shepherds as recorded in Luke 2:10 was as recorded in that verse proclaimed as Good News for ALL PEOPLE! This is still the Good News for all people today, and we as Christians continue to celebrate it as we accept the Savior mentioned in verse 2:11 as our personal Savior. This joy then takes on deeper and eternal significance compared to the short-lived secular celebration. My hope is that the following devotional guide may be used in any way that helps make the message of Advent and Christmas more meaningful to you.



Sharing the Message of Advent

Week 1: HOPE - Read John 1:1-8

What is something you have hoped for that never came about? What is our hope in Christ and why is it secure? Sing "O Come All Ye Faithful" to indicate your intention to join others this Christmas at the manger to worship the King. Close with prayer.

Week 2: JOY - Read Matthew 2:7-12

Share a joyous Christmas that you remember. Continue with description of the joy you experienced when you found Christ as your Savior. How does that joy impact your life now? Join in singing "Joy to the World" and share in prayer.

Week 3: PEACE - Read Psalm 23

Describe a difficult time when you were in despair or conflict and yet felt God's peace within you. How does this personal peace within us impact our health and personality? Sing "Silent Night" and have a time of family prayer.

Week 4: LOVE - Read Luke 1:78

Why is God's love in Christ considered as a gift? Describe a time when you enjoyed receiving a gift and tell why it brought joy. Describe a time when giving a gift brought joy and why. Sing some carols and share together in prayer.

Christmas Eve or Day – Read the Christmas Story, with everyone sharing some Christmas memories. Share something special about this Christmas Season and tell why it is/was special. Sing carols and pray together!





"To everything there is a season; and a time for every purpose under heaven . . . a time to keep silent and a time to speak." Ecclesiastes 3:1 & 7b

She then said, "I will never forget it, when I told Jo, she took my hands and prayed for them. She also said the Lord grieves with us when we have lost someone we love as Jesus did." When I came home, I shared with John what the Lord had done and how sweet it was of Him to have someone else share His goodness and mercy. Isn't our Heavenly Father just so amazing, kind, loving, creative, faithful, and on and on.

P.S. Shortly after returning to FL, we went to our club for dinner and so many of our friends came by to hug us and to welcome us back. Later that night, I said to the Lord, perhaps this is a small example of our arriving in heaven and being welcomed and loved by our Lord Jesus Christ, family, and friends.

Thank you, dear Jesus, for coming to earth, taking all of our sins upon Yourself, and making the way to the Father by the power of the Holy Spirit so we may spend eternity with you.




