



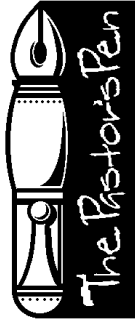

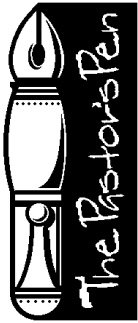
. . . National recognition for Missions giving, DBC being in the top 10% of all American Baptist Churches, which numbers approximately 5,000 congregations . . .

Blessed to be joined with each of you as we enter a new year of service – yes EXPANDING SERVICE – to God's call on our lives . . .

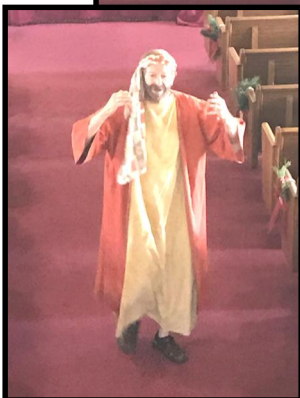

2020—New Year

"Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing. Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the desert and streams in the wasteland." Isaiah 43:18-19

"And the dream was repeated to Pharaoh twice, because the thing is established by God, and God will shortly bring it to pass." Gen. 41:32

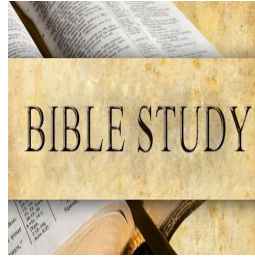

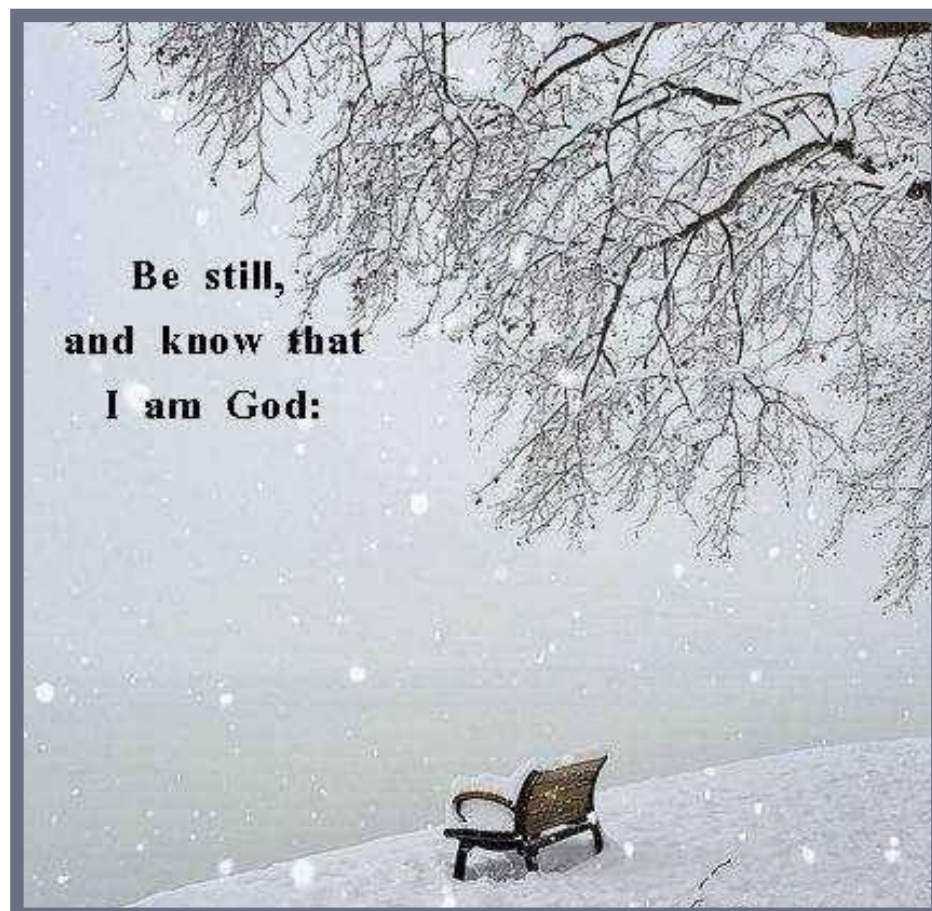
