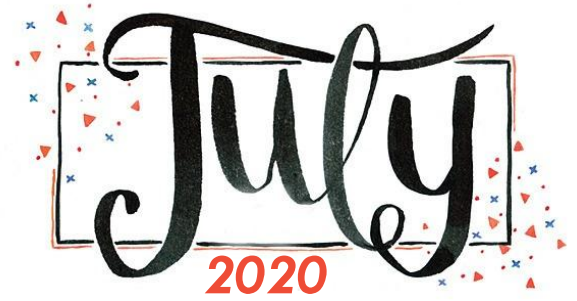


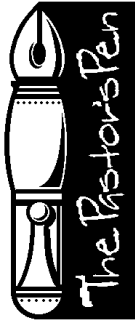

FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

As I begin this, I'm sure many of you join me – or I join you – in feelings of anxiousness to get back to “normal” Sunday services! But wait . . . what we each and all may be thinking as “normal” – may never come back in our lifetimes. And two words I believe God is calling us to make part of our vocabularies are “negative” versus “blessing”. While I’m sure there’s no one reading this who is rejoicing at what we’re experiencing, there is a *positive* and *bright* side of *GOD BEING IN CONTROL* . . . regardless of the variety of feelings we may dealing with. Again, and again in His Word, we find the assurance of this promise . . .

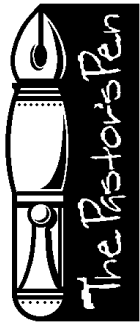
I believe it’s important to identify two characteristics that complicate our current situation. First, we’re experiencing *something we’ve never faced previously*, although a very few have memories of our parents describing their lives during the Flu epidemic 100+ years ago. And secondly, *opinions and viewpoints are very divided across our country*, even within families and varying from day to day!

As Christians and active participants as the *Family of God*, we are *called* to respond both as individuals and as the Body of Christ as part of DeSoto Baptist Family. Watching from across our country **two** responses seem prevalent . . . “*Church will go on as usual, and God will protect us.*” . . . and “*Church will follow strict guidelines, caring for neighbors as Jesus taught, with respect and protection.*”

Since Day 1, I’ve been involved in extensive education and investigation from a wide variety of sources . . . and dozens of these specifically focused on God’s congregations, both within our own Denominational Region and extending to other reliable and respected groups. . . giving deeply researched and well thought out guidelines. Our own Central Region - composed of 200 American Churches throughout Kansas with a few in Oklahoma and Arkansas - is doing a significant job of sharing *and educating*.

I’m very blessed and pleased that DeSoto Baptist has established a “Reopening Committee” to help with fact gathering and formation of recommendations – looking at precautionary practices as days pass and we look at the “how” and “when” of reopening. . . please note this is not saying “GOING BACK TO WHAT WE USED TO HAVE AND DO”!!! Things will be changed as we could never before have imagined as we are called to new ways of worship! It’s a great blessing to have this Committee with a diversity of experiences to help with this. And gratitude is expressed to Matt Burns, Jeff Hodges, Charles Lawhead, Matt McQuality, Doug Opdycke, Monica Walker, and Mary Etta and myself.

Some of the projected changes which are both challenging and probably not what we'd like are no Hymnals or Bibles in pew racks, no Congregational singing, Offering Plates at door when you leave, special cleaning procedures after each service, limited seating of approximately 50 in Sanctuary with room for about 20 in basement and potential for listening on radios in cars. The very positive and exciting news is that as a result of God using this experience for us to begin and recognize the value of online services is that it was voted at the last Business Meeting to purchase adequate equipment to keep recording and broadcasting to a new and expanded "watching congregation" numbering into the **hundreds** from outside our normal attending congregation of the past!!!

In closing I share II Chronicles 7:14 . . . *"If my people who are called by my name will humble themselves, and pray and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and heal their land."*

A MOMENT WITH JO

“Heal me, O Lord, and I will be healed; Save me, O Lord, and I will be saved, for You are my praise.” Jeremiah 17:14

A few days ago, a family member, not immediate family, called and we had a nice visit. He then told me that the last week had been difficult for his family. 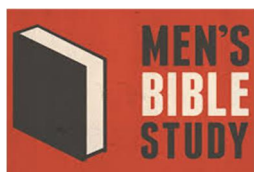
