







FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

The season of Advent and Christmas has so quickly passed us by. This month of February brings reminders of our usual activities, of which major changes have been brought due to the challenging time in which we're now living and adapting! First to come to mind is the blessing of last year's CELEBRATION OF LOVE BANQUET, the 50th such event in our history, and a major contributor to the LOVE GIFT emphasis of ABW for Missions. This offering (actually promoted by ABW groups each month of the year with coverage of a variety

of outreaches of Missions needs all over the world) last year totaled \$2,279 from just this event. YES, you read this right! Quite an accomplishment for a fund that began during Depression era with women donating just pennies, nickels, and dimes for the sharing of God's love throughout the world. Any ideas for new ways for accomplishing things we're now not able to do in the traditional ways of the past as we seek the welfare of all our Church Family? If so, I've been alerted that our women are open and listening!

While it may seem early, we begin the season of Lent with Ash Wednesday on **February 17**th which leads us on to Holy Week beginning with Palm Sunday on **April 28**th, and moving into **Easter on April 4**th. Tentatively we plan to hold observance of Maundy Thursday with a service at the church at 7:00 p.m. on **April 1**st and the traditional two services on **Easter Sunday** at 9:30 a.m. and 11:00 a.m.

An added feature this season of Lent will be the reading from the Gospel of Luke, a part of the journey to the Cross and Easter. Aaron Brownell has provided a Bible reading schedule which we invite you to join in through your personal daily time with God, whether it be individually, as couples, or as families. Passages from Luke will also be a source of focus during our Sunday sermons of the Lenten season.

During these times of challenge, change, and occasional frustration, our 1st Sunday monthly Communion has taken on a new process! We are using an enclosed cup with wafer on top, so only the individual partaking in Communion does any touching; and we continue to do this on the first Sunday of each month. A MOMENT WITH JO

Sing to the Lord

Psalm 66:2 "Sing out the honor of His name; make His praises glorious."

Psalm 100:2 "Serve the Lord with gladness; come before His presence with singing."

James 5:13 "Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray. Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing psalms."

What a blessing when we do what we know pleases our Heavenly Father and we are filled with joy. Even when I am not aware of singing, I have people who tell me, "you are always singing." A devotional book about songs and psalms gave me a better understanding of this fact. The author, David Mclaughlin, writes, "Even at work, even in times of hardship, even in our despair, Lord, we could not help, but sing if we truly understood Your works, because we know that to be true. Encourage us to sing Your praises, even when we feel least like doing so, because when we get to heaven, we might look back and wonder why we weren't always singing."

My Grandmother West had a lovely alto voice and as I sat with her often in church, as my mother played the piano, Grandmother would put her finger on the harmony notes in the hymnal, teaching me to sing plus to memorize the words. I am very thankful for learning hymns as a young person and I sing them often today. Another wonderful experience was when John and I were members of a couples' prayer group and the only songs we sang were Scripture psalms from KJV. They continually bubble up in my heart and I am amazed how these psalms are exactly what is needed at that time. Also, Christian songs from the last 45 years or so are always ready to come forth.

When I was having chemo treatments for Lymphoma, one morning as I was trying to make a cup of tea, I was humming a song and when I paid attention to it, the song was "He Touched Me". Oh, the joy in my heart as I said to the Lord, " Thank you for touching and healing me."

I Corinthians 14:15 "What is it then? I will pray with the spirit, and I will pray with the understanding also, I will sing with the spirit, and I will sing with the understanding also. Praise be to God".

As English preacher Charles Spurgeon said, "When your heart is full of Christ, you want to sing". So let us sing, sing praises to our glorious Jesus.

ABW, American Baptist Women, was founded in Buffalo, New York in 1951 by 1600 American Baptist Women as the *National Council of American Baptist Women*. Through the years it has grown, expanded, and updated to meet God's call for ministry to a diverse needy population of several thousand throughout (but not limited to) our own community and worldwide.

From the very beginning of the founding of De Soto Baptist Church in 1947, ABW became reality under the leadership of our beloved Dorothy Nalley! Throughout the years the outreach has become monumental. Structure of organization includes 4 Divisions: Administration, Personal Development Ministries, Church & Community Ministries, and Mission & Service Ministries. Administration includes President, Secretary, and Treasurer, all focused on the organization of the designated areas.

PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT focuses on our individual growth as Christians and includes **Love Gift**, the Offering for Missions begun back during Depression years, when pennies were literally all that would be donated. Our own Love Gift Banquet with a history of 50 years celebrates both the covenant of marriage as well as the opportunity to donate additional funds for this vital monetary event benefiting both Region and National needs. Participation at annual Conference of the Region is significant, as is local opportunities such as Bible Studies.

CHURCH & COMMUNITY MINISTRIES is widespread in outreach at De Soto Baptist. The outreaches include Food Pantry, school needs, VBS, De Soto Days, Trunk or Treat, Easter Egg Hunt, Thanksgiving Dinner, funeral meals, nursing home connections, and countless others.

MISSIONS & SERVICE brings the joyful opportunity for us to be servants of outreach both here in De Soto as well as throughout our country and into continents worldwide. We are blessed to have the nearby missions of Bethel Neighborhood Center in KCK which has an outreach of around 12,000, we also are involved in significant outreach to Murrow Indian Children's Home in Muskogee, Oklahoma, as well as the entire Indian region in that state. Writing this, great memories - with smiles - of our road trip there with several cars loaded with women and supplies on our way to a mini retreat in "beautiful Bella Vista". (Mary Etta gives permission for someone else to figure route & mileage through those hills into the night!!!) WHITE CROSS, which deals with various supplies needed on Missions fields – both handmade and purchased – is our contributions avenue to supply needs throughout the world, often very cheap and easy for us, but of monumental significance to those ministering in far-off lands.



40 days in the Gospel of Luke

Forty days is not a long time, but it is a powerful number of days and is seen countless times throughout the Bible. Just as the rain fell on Noah for forty days, or Moses fasted for forty days before he could receive the ten commandments, or the forty days Jesus spent in the wilderness being tempted by Satan, we know God can accomplish great and mighty things in the lives of His children in just forty days.


Luke's Gospel is perhaps the most cohesive telling of the story of Jesus Christ. We learn about His time in the temple, the encounter on the road to Emmaus, parables like 'The Good Samaritan' and 'The Prodigal Son', His passion for the poor, and willingness to spend time with people from all levels of society. In Luke, Jesus gives us the most explicit instructions as to what true discipleship really means. He models this through His relationships, His behavior, His teachings and through His unwavering obedience to the will of the Father; willingly dying on the cross as the atoning sacrifice for sin.

Spending 40 days reading, studying, and absorbing the Gospel of Luke is an opportunity to not only grow stronger in your faith, but to also have a rewarding and enriching experience during the weeks leading up to Easter. Starting on Ash Wednesday, the 17th, I urge you to make this commitment to reading through the Gospel of Luke with us and continue the journey that Pastor started us on leading up to Christmas.

Reading Luke in 40 Days

Follow this schedule from Ash Wednesday until Easter and you will read the Gospel of Luke. On Sundays, you may want to reread text that tugged at you or focus on the passages used in worship.
