Why did what I'm reading take place" . . . and the list can grow as you embark on this incredible journey with our Lord and Savior!!!

So often thoughts turn only to Easter Sunday, while of equal significance and life impacting worth are the other notable events of the journey – especially those of Holy Week - which will find greater focus in our April Newsletter. And if you've not yet started on this journey, it's not too late. You may just have to do some extra reading at some point! May God bless each of you, and our entire Church Family, as we share in this journey together.

I close with words of appreciation for Aaron's time spent in the organization of this journey, which promises to be impacting to everyone who joins in with the dedication and opening of minds and lives to which God calls us.

The Caring Heart of De Soto Baptist

As the De Soto Baptist Women's Associate for Church and Community Relations, one of my greatest privileges and joys is to help connect our church family to the needs of our community. Often the projects that might start with our ABW actually become projects for our entire church family: the Bethel Christmas Family Adoption, Operation Christmas (De Soto), Caps for Kids, Snacks for Starside, School Supplies, Trunk or Treat, Easter Egg Hunts.

We are told to care for the poor and needy, to be our brother's keeper, to help others in any way that is right and good. And, we witness that throughout our year. De Soto Baptist has a big heart for missions. . whether around the world or across the street.

Your response to our Caps for Kids was not just heart-warming for us to watch, but hand and head-warming for the recipients, whether through Bethel or the Service League project that delivered those caps and gloves to children in Johnson, Wyandotte, and Leavenworth Counties. During this past week of snow and severe cold, I thought how timely our drive was. . .carrying over into February.....I know that those families were so thankful for those caps that were delivered in late January---not too late, but "right on time."

Because we have developed a reputation for "having a heart" for Starside and helping with unexpected needs, the counselor reached out to me a little over a week ago to see if we could possibly help provide some school supplies right now this semester- for the kids at Starside. Because of CoVid and the unknown schedule for schools last fall, we hadn't held the usual School Supply Drive that Starside needs. Because of the large percentage of Starside families needing help for lunches and basic school supplies, our summer drives have become very important to them. With our schools returning to full-time attendance, their supply of basic school items had run out. (She was unaware that we had been the ones sending snacks these recent months.)

I had remembered that we had carried over a balance for school supplies from the 2019 drive, so, thanks to local merchants and internet bargains, we were able to deliver basic school supplies for 25-30 children. The Starside folks greatly appreciate our generosity in providing not only the snacks but also those basic supplies. How pleased we should be that we are known for our caring and generous hearts.

The supplies we delivered will probably not meet all of their needs for this semester, but they do give the children and the teachers a great lift, knowing that others care enough to help. Once they distribute these supplies, they will let us know of any additional critical needs.

A recent happening to me was the result of a stupid act of leaving the dishwasher lid down as I bustled around wiping counter tops and placing dishes in the racks. Oh, you know what happened, I hit the corner of the door with my shin, turned under a large flap of skin and began to bleed over the floor and in my shoe. I yelled for John, grabbed large amounts of paper towels and finally was able to slow the flow somewhat. John wrapped my leg with towels and shipping tape and off to the ER.

Dear Jesus, please stop this pain and heal my leg, I prayed continually to hospital. We arrived at 1:50 p.m. and I would like to say it was a short wait, but at 7 p.m., I asked the attendant who was calling names if he thought it might be soon as I had been waiting for 5 hours. People around us said, "you have been here for 5 hours?" Within 30 minutes, my name was called and taken back for aid. As the nurse tried to remove the bandage, I yelled, "help me, please Jesus". She put moisture on it to be able to remove it and in came the doctor. He kept talking of what he would do and without telling me, he quickly flipped the flap back into its proper position. He said, no stitches, but small strips to hold it. I marveled at Jesus' immediate response to my urgent request to help me. Three weeks later and having Home Health Care visiting nurses, I am healing well and back to walks, but not exercise.

We know our dear Jesus Christ always hears our prayers and we know sometimes it is not the answer we wish, but that moment in ER has continually been a great comfort to me as I heal. Thank You. Lord Jesus.

Significant and unique opportunities lie before each of us as Missionaries in or our communitity and neighborhoods . . . perhaps in our schools where snacks are needed for those whose parents may lack the funds for these daily needs . . . or in provision of hats, scarves, and gloves for children who come to school in freezing weather without these . . . or in the donations of food products to town pantries . . . or in answering of other calls as God may orchestrate in these times of great stress. And in reality there can be no better solution than to get our minds off our own personal challenges, changes, and even disappointments, recognized during these trying times as being inescapable. Fitting in with this is a memory going back 70 years when as a 10 year old reading the Leavenworth Times was such a priority for me that I motivated our bicycle riding paper boy to throw and extra copy so I didn't have to wait for my Dad to finish reading before I got it! The main article I've remembered all these years was a Psychology column by a Dr. Crane, with a strong emphasis on the concept "Go through the proper motions and you'll feel the proper emotions!" Hmmmm . . . could this possibly fit in with answering God's call on our lives for various actions to which we're directed? Could getting our minds off ourselves and the increasing challenges being faced with a turn in the direction of hearing, answering God's call on our lives to His love and leading in possibly new arenas of outreach – or being "servant missionaries" in our own communities be the calling to each of us now?

How truly blessed we are to be part of a Denomination which encourages and provides for the opportunities to embark on Ministries of Outreach from specific needs in our own community to those stretching from boundary to boundary across America. Offerings for this outreach of Missions can be given throughout the month of March, with the designation of America For Christ so designated.


Luke's Gospel is perhaps the most cohesive telling of the story of Jesus Christ. We learn about His time in the temple, the encounter on the road to Emmaus, parables like 'The Good Samaritan' and 'The Prodigal Son', His passion for the poor, and willingness to spend time with people from all levels of society. In Luke, Jesus gives us the most explicit instructions as to what true discipleship really means. He models this through His relationships, His behavior, His teachings and through His unwavering obedience to the will of the Father; willingly dying on the cross as the atoning sacrifice for sin.

Spending 40 days reading, studying, and absorbing the Gospel of Luke is an opportunity to not only grow stronger in your faith, but to also have a rewarding and enriching experience during the weeks leading up to Easter. Starting on Ash Wednesday, the 17th, I urge you to make this commitment to reading through the Gospel of Luke with us and continue the journey that Pastor started us on leading up to Christmas.
