



*Children 4-5 (who have not attended Kindergarten) will be part of the great Pre-K classes and fun.


*Children who have completed Kindergarten through 4th grade make up our elementary teams.

ONE DE SOTO REFLIEF FUND


For citizens of De Soto affected by COVID-19
