Exodus Chapter 4 and verse 2...

"And the LORD said unto him, 'What is that in thine hand?'
and he [Moses] said, 'A rod'."(KJV)

This is the first time in scripture that we find out that Moses had a staff. Now the staff was an everyday item that Moses had appropriated for himself, to use as a walking stick, as a device for guiding sheep, and as a weapon when necessary. There was nothing special about it. It was just a stout piece of wood.

Until Moses turned aside to meet with God.

Now the staff has become more than ordinary. Now it is a tool which God will use to perform wonders before men and bring glory to Himself. Just an hour before the incident in Exodus 4, Moses and his staff were normal, everyday pieces of the desert landscape. Now a prophet goes forth to be used of God to change the nation of Israel forever.

Moses will use his staff to do many miracles in Egypt, to part the waters of the Red Sea, and to bring water forth from a rock in the desert.

I believe God can and will do the same thing through us. Everyday people one moment. Empowered by God the next to be of service in His kingdom. The power is all His. The strength is all His. The wisdom is all His. We simply need to hear His call to our hearts and make ourselves available.

### A Moment with Jo...

Acts 8:1,"At that time a great persecution arose against the church."

This word church in Greek is Ecclesia, which is used to describe an assembly or company of Christians in several ways. One is a company of them gathering for worship, sharing, and teaching. I would like to share of such a time aboard the Queen Mary Ship that John and I took last July. The day we boarded, which was a Saturday, I looked at Sunday's list of happenings for that day. I noticed a "Christian Gathering" in the Boardroom at 9 a.m. and then the ship's church service at 10 a.m. with the Captain presiding. I decided that I would go to both the next day, which I did, but had some trouble finding the room, so I was a few minutes late. As I entered the room, there were 5-6 people and they all smiled and welcomed me to come and sit, told me their names and asked mine. An older man said, " we are here to worship Jesus this morning and would someone like to open with prayer? A younger man (48) began and for a wonderful hour we shared and prayed and thanked Father, Jesus, and Holy Spirit for meeting us so gloriously. Then we all went to the Ship's service, which was filled with hymns and the readings of the Bible with different officers reading NT and OT with a prayer ending it. It was a lovely experience in a sweet surrounding.

I was unaware the Boardroom was reserved for the entire week, so I missed Monday, but then I saw that it had continued. We had 2 college students from 2 different schools and both had only known Jesus as Savior for 6-9 months. We had a glorious time as we mentored them, prayed and blessed them to fulfill their God-ordained ministry of salvation to friends and family. What a beginning for a long journey, but an amazing one. Jesus is so wonderful to allow us to share in His drawing people to Himself.



The first Sunday in October we will add another Adult Sunday School class to our program.

The subject matter will be "Biblical Basics" and it will meet in the basement of the church.

The current study on the book of Acts will continue in the upstairs classroom.
