





This month I want to introduce you to Cadence International.

In 1982, Rhonda and I moved to Vicenza, Italy to serve with the United States Army. We discovered, or perhaps I should say, we were discovered, by other military personnel who were attending an off-base mission organization called Overseas Christian Servicemen's Center or OCSC for short. They invited us to come, and we went.

For a couple of young kids, (I was 20 and Rhonda was 19) the people at the mission were a breath of fresh air. They became our "home away from home". They cared about us and welcomed us into their home. They fed us dinners, and we went on trips together. When I say "us", I mean Rhonda and I and our newborn and usually ten to twelve other soldiers and their families. They re-grounded us to family and Christian fundamentals and gave us an alternative to the military night life.

But the most important thing they shared with us was their Jesus. These people were real. They lived their faith. They didn't just go to chapel on Sunday and forget God the rest of the week. They lived a relational lifestyle with Jesus. Everything they did. Everywhere they went. Jesus was present in the activity. I saw this and I knew my relationship with Jesus was shallow and really non-existent. It was a new concept for me. The reality of Jesus. And so, one night at the Hospitality House in Vicenza, after an evening worship service, I accepted Jesus as my Lord and Savior and my Friend.

This is what Cadence does. And they do it well. They have missionaries scattered across the United States and the world, doing for servicemen and women, what they did for Rhonda and I and our family during that crucial period in our lives. They are a faith-based organization and the missionaries serving with Cadence raise their own support before they go. Others like you and I who are here on the Homefront but have a heart for missions and the military sign up to support them as they go out. Rhonda and I have been supporting Cadence missions for many years with our giving.

This month I have invited Wes and Elaine Auldridge to come and share with us about Cadence and their new mission outreach to the airmen and women and their families at Whiteman AFB not far from us outside of Knob Noster, Missouri. I hope that there may come a time in the future when we can partner with them and put some "boots on the ground" to assist them in sharing Jesus with those who have chosen to serve our country at the sacrifice of themselves.

WHAT SNACKS ARE SUGGESTED?


